Ideas for living it out

- Giving: Support a missionary financially by donating to his or her ministry
- Preparation: Help with packing, cleaning their home, or watching their children
- Communication: Help the missionary send out ministry updates and newsletters
- Prayer: Mobilize people from your church to pray for a missionary
- Encouragement: Send notes of encouragement, Christmas and birthday cards, packages and gifts especially around holidays; call, text, or video chat
- Remembering their children: Set up video chats with your kids and theirs, send notes and gifts to their children
- Returning: When missionaries come home, assist them with phone, SIM cards, housing, transportation, food, and toys for their children
